Pet owners watch out

The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries Animal Welfare team is urging pet owners across the NT to be vigilant for signs of dog poisoning.

Dogs can be poisoned in several ways – by ingesting

household items, consuming toxic plants or human foods, or in more serious cases, falling victim to illegal dog baiting.

Common signs of suspected poisoning include:

- Sudden vomiting or diarrhea
- Excessive drooling or foaming at the mouth
- Unusual lethargy or weakness
- Difficulty breathing or persistent coughing
- Seizures or trembling
- Disorientation or collapse.

If your pet is showing any of these symptoms seek veterinary help immediately.

A lifeline on four wheels: How a no-interest loan helped Toni stay independent

Toni, a gentle soul in his seventies, shares his days with Buddy — a lively galah whose chatter lifts his spirits as he manages life with depression.



When Toni's old car broke down, his independence was at risk.

The car meant groceries, doctor's visits, and staying connected. On a fixed Age Pension, the cost of repairs and tyres felt impossible.

That's when Toni discovered the No Interest Loan Scheme (NILs). With kind support, he applied and was approved — a moment that brought tears of relief.

"This loan isn't just money," he said. "It's a lifeline for people like me."

Now, Toni's car is back on the road, Buddy rides shotgun, and Toni has regained hope and control.

Browns Mart is a proud supporter and a Seniors Card Business Partner, and has kindly donated a double pass to their next **show,** We Keep Everything.


Created and performed by Lisa Pellegrino, this is a story of family, memory and legacy.

Big changes are coming to age care. From 1 November 2025, a new Aged Care Act will come into effect.

To help people understand what's changing, COTA Australia and the Older Persons Advocacy Network (OPAN) are hosting free community information sessions around Australia.
